• 4-Days in Aix en Provence (France) may 2018: a wonderful weather, a great moment of Rotary with 107 Rotarians from 14 countries, 2 continents, who shared these moments of friendship and conviviality on the roads of Provence with a highlight, the ascent of Mont Ventoux. With the help from all, any social actions have been carried out under the leadership of Rotary Aix en Provence Connection.



• The Rotary International championships in Le Creusot (France), September 2018. An organization quite like for professionals, races contested and magnificent podiums, under the patronage of the 1975 & 1977 Tours de France 1975 and 1977 winner, Bernard Thévenet. The strongest have won ... the others have done well! The route on a test circuit for trucks was extremely secure, we had no accident or trouble during the week-end. • FCS Members supported **Ride to End Polio**, which raised \$ 5.7 million this year !!! Rotarian cyclists, as they do every year, met in November in Tucson, Arizona, to compete in the great El Tour de Tucson ride. In 10 years, Ride to End Polio raised \$ 53.3 million to combat polio. Dozens of millions of children have been spared from this scourge!

• 2018 Junior Cyclothon organized by the young Rotary Club Palava (Mumbai, India): a 5 km ride for children aged 5 to 15 to raise awareness of thalassemia syndromes. Many young people also recalled that cycling is an important element for hygiene and good health.



• Our actions, our social projects are not only vectors for raising funds but the means to implement the founding pillar of Rotary International, peace and

friendship between peoples. We can only rent our friend and member from Tatarstan (Russia) Ildus Yanishev who realized in 17 months a complete world tour on his bike weighing 50 kgs!!! Ildus has developed a real research laboratory on the place of cycling in the various companies of the countries crossed. We were many to welcome him to Kazan on October 7th!
